For more than three decades, BKS has provided development assistance to the children, women and families of Jharkhand. We provide assistance in the areas of Child Protection, Education, Skill/ Livelihood Training and Placements, Women Empowerment, Health and Sanitation, Agriculture, Research & Advocacy, Awareness, Workshop and Training and Humanitarian Aid among others. We have worked to ensure that children & women are protected and given proper care & rehabilitation. Yet we recognize the interdependence and the frailty of our work, how a single calamity—a famine, a disease, a war—can have devastating impacts on people and the long-term development of their communities. This financial year end marked the beginning of the pandemic COVID-19 all over the world.



In this year we have implemented some highly successful programmes and activities through which we have been able to reach around 92,000 (approx.) children directly and 2,00,000 (approx.) indirectly, 25,000 (approx.) adolescent youths and girls, 80,000 (approx.) women, 35,000 (approx.) men and around 3,00,000 – 3,50,000 community people.

Furthermore, we hope this report will convey the color and vibrancy of the communities we serve, as well as the people of Jharkhand: the mothers, the children and the community. Thank you for your continued support sharing our commitment to the people of Jharkhand.

We also thank our individual, corporate and institutional partners, who have unflinchingly supported our work throughout the year, which has brought us closer to achieving our goal of working with more than 50 lakhs of people by 2020. Our partnership with TDH, the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands and Government of Jharkhand has led us to combat trafficking, child labour and child marriage. During the year, we worked closely with national and state governments to implement our programmes, and provided inputs in their policy making process. Without their support and guidance, we would not have been able to reach more than 20 lakhs of people in India to make positive changes in their lives and livelihoods.

And finally, I would like to thank all members of the BKS family as well as all our partners, donors, peer organizations, and other stakeholders who continue to support and believe in our work.

About BKS

History

Bhartya Kisan Sangh (BKS) now renamed as "Bal Kalyan Sangh" was established in 1978 as a farmer's movement. The objective was to educate and empower the underprivileged community of Eastern India to achieve self-sufficiency. While working towards this, the organization had studied the migration pattern and the related vulnerabilities that women and children face in their operational villages. Since then the organization initiated a holistic programme to address the vulnerabilities of women and children in Jharkhand (Eastern India).

Currently, BKS has spread out its work into several programmes like: 1) Child Protection 2) Education 3) Skill training, Livelihood and Placements 4) Women Empowerment 5) Health and Sanitation 6) Agriculture 7) Humanitarian Aid 8) Research & Advocacy and 9) Training & Workshops where Child Protection and extending support services to the trafficked girls have been the mainstay of our work.

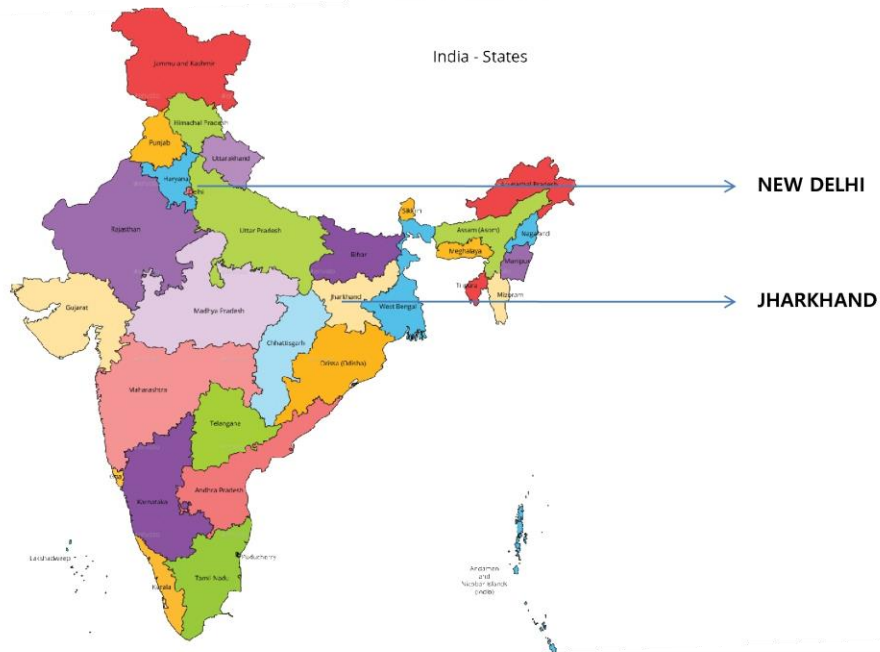

CHILD PROTECTION

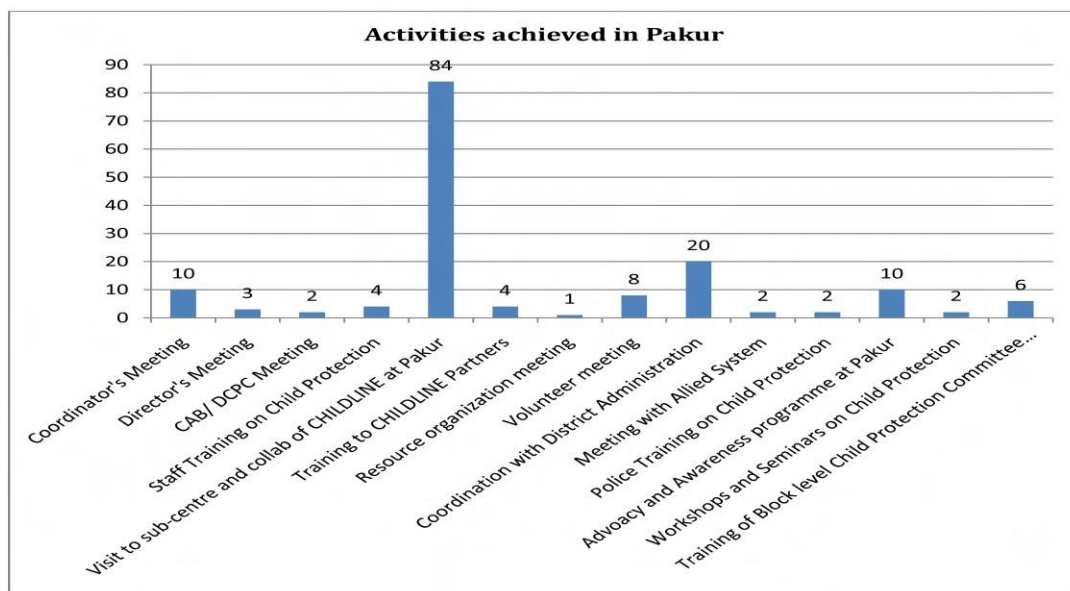
A. Childline Pakur & Dhanbad

CHILDLINE works for the Protection of rights of all children aged from 0 to 18. Their special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more vulnerable sections. It also helps children who are in need of care and protection. CHILDLINE No. is -1098. CHILDLINE receives an average a million calls a years and CHILDLINE rescues about 3,00,000 children annually..

Whereas, BKS is implementing the CHILDLINE service in Dhanbad as Collaborative organization. In this FY, BKS has conducted the below activities:



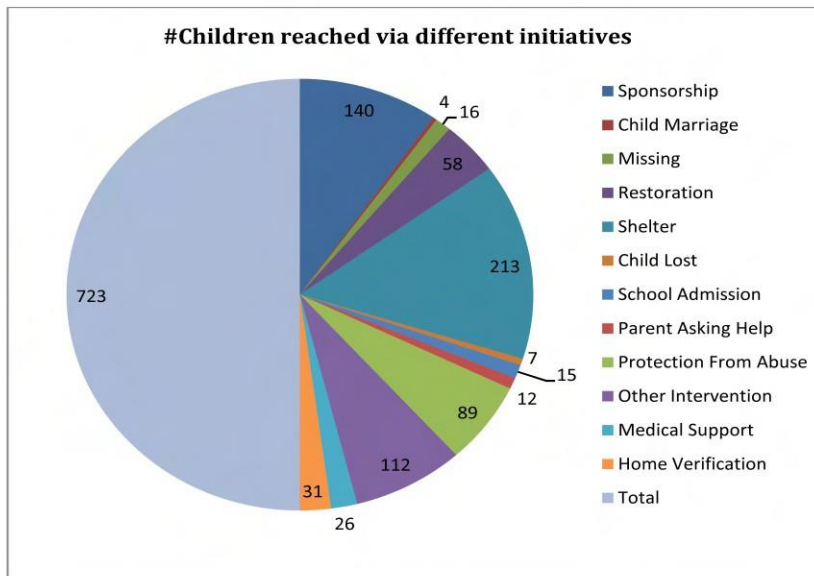
- Aspecial awareness programme on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao was held at Rajendra Balika High School, Katras.

B. SRC/IRRC

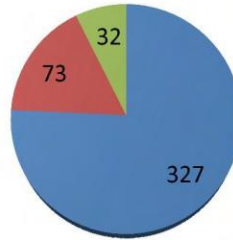
The State Resource Centre (SRC) is located at the District Collectorate Building, Kutchery, Ranchi that also runs a helpline No. 18003457055 (For trafficking & missing children & women) & the Integrated Rehabilitation cum Resource Centre (IRRC) is located at Vasant Kunj, New Delhi that also runs a toll free No. 10582 which is implemented by BKS with support of JWDS, Dept. of Social Welfare WCD & Social Security, Govt. of Jharkhand (GOJ) is an initiative towards trafficking free Jharkhand. These helplines are a medium for rescue, repatriation & rehabilitation of children and women from trafficking and unsafe migration. BKS is focusing on 72 care plans for providing protection and securing rights to children. Need-based education, holistic development and financial independence of these children are the significant parts of this plan. In the financial year 2018-19, 327 cases were registered in which 73 children were rescued and 32 children were restored via IRRC whereas 338 cases were registered in which 97 children were rescued and 102 children were restored via SRC. The end of the financial year also marked all of us to support vulnerable women and children of Jharkhand through humanitarian relief activities for lockdown due to Covid-19 pandemic.

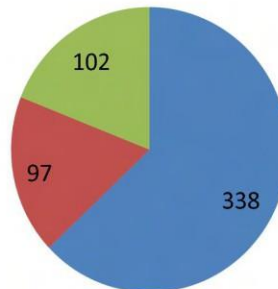
Activities of IRRC

Activities of SRC

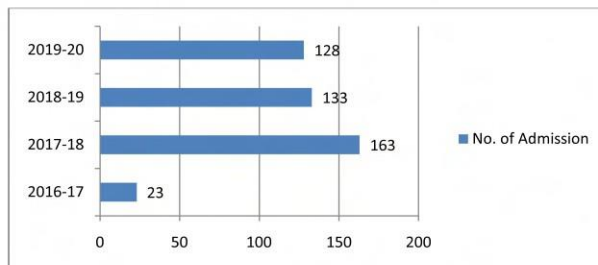

C. BALKUNJ

Balkunj is a Child Care Institution of BKS situated at West Singhbhum (Chaibasa) particularly for boys in the age group of 6 to 18 years which got started in the month of September, 2016. The children who went missing or are footpath beggars, wanderers, child rescued from any sort of child labor, children whose parents are no more and doesn't have a place to stay are provided the facility of shelter, food, counseling, care, daily needs, education and different types of training on life skill and increasing motivation.

Year wise admissions held till now:

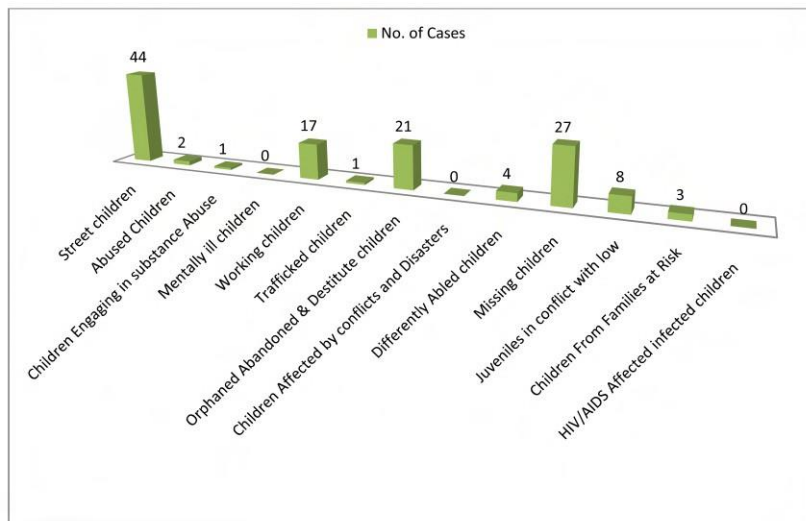


Starting from FY 2016-17 to FY 2019-20 there have been increase in number of admissions of children at Balkunj (CCI), West Singhbhum.

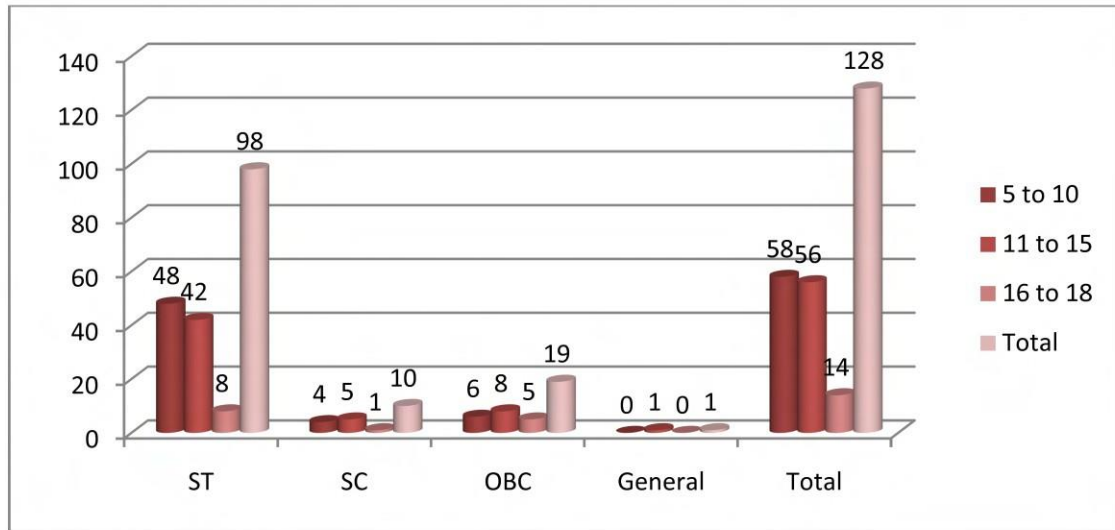
Month Wise Breakup of Admission & Restoration

Total **128 admissions** and **115 restorations** were done in the FY 2019-2020. In this **94 restorations** were those children who were admitted in the year 2019-20.

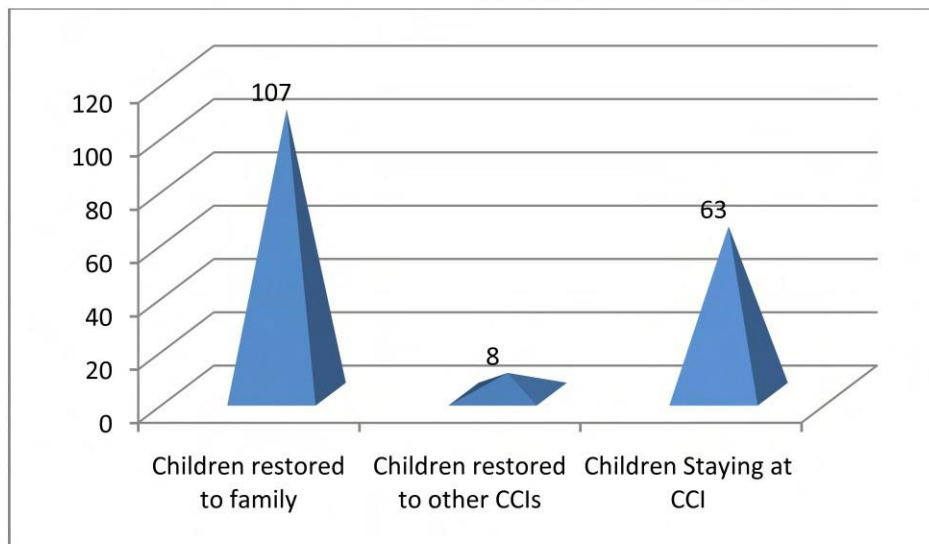
Categories of cases

D. OPEN SHELTER HOME (BOYS), DUMKA

BKS has inaugurated the Open Shelter Home for Boys at Dumka in the year 2019 for children in need of care and protection, which is an important service aimed at ensuring proper care, protection and contribution in overall development of children up to the age of 18 years. Objective is to provide shelter, proper care and protection to children living in difficult circumstances without parental care; provide shelters to those children whose case is pending before child welfare committee till final decision is made or restoration in family is ensured and coordination with JSCPS, DCPS, CWC and local police for rescue, rehabilitation and providing institutional care to children living in difficult circumstances and vulnerable conditions. Till now BKS has supported 50 children through this home and is continuing its service for best interest of children in Jharkhand.



EDUCATION

BKS is striving hard to lighten the significance of education among children from the mica-affected families of Koderma. The organization for this purpose has roped in 900 children to the Anganwadi Centres (AWC's) from villages. Ten AWC's have been developed as model centres so that the children are attracted towards education and art. In the process of utilizing waste materials, old tyres etc. are being used and developed as play-code materials. Apart from this, 10 schools have also been developed as model schools through playful learning methods and use of digital learning techniques.

A. Child Protection Programme in MICA mining areas of Jharkhand''

Objective: To contribute to the elimination of worst forms of child labour in the mica mining belt in Jharkhand and Bihar, India. This project is supported by Terre Des Homes and is being implemented in Koderma, Jharkhand.

Focus: Educational rehabilitation of child labourers and economic rehabilitation of their families. The project will strengthen the local institutions to sustain the development process initiated by the project in 32 villages spreading across

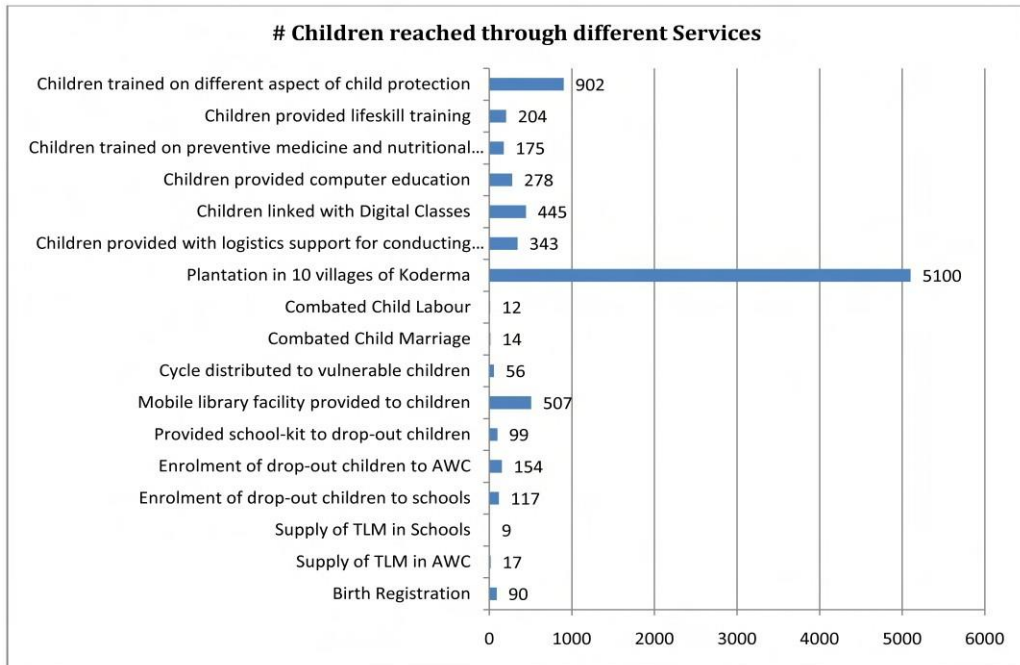


Koderma and Giridih districts of Jharkhand.

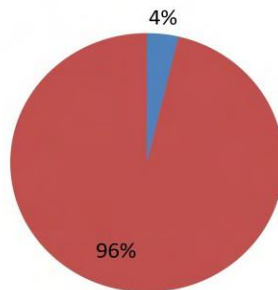

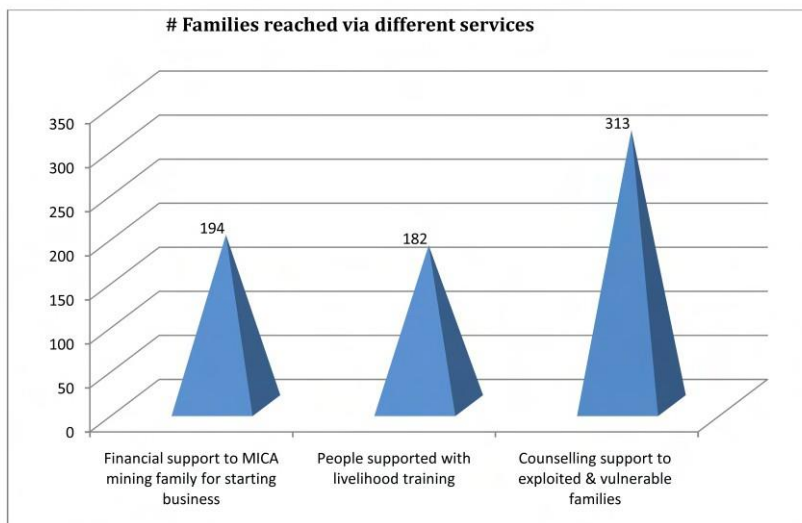
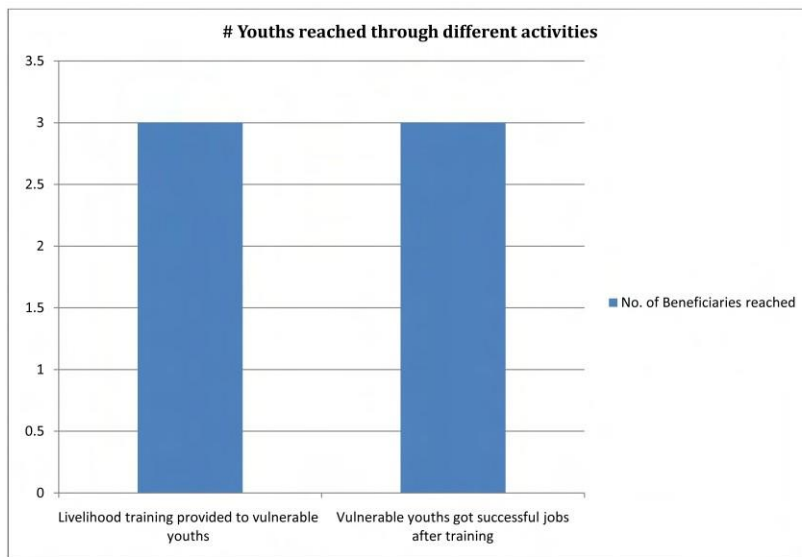

B. BKS Running Schools

BKS's education programme aims to improve conditions of children especially girls by educating them and mainstreaming them to schools following the enactment of the Right to Education Act by the Government. BKS is nominated as State level Mother NGO by Jharkhand Education Project Council (JEPC) for Hard to Reach Children like Migratory Children, Child Labour, and Survivor of Trafficking. It has implemented different projects and has been able to mainstream a number of children to formal school along with encouraging them through life skill training and language learning strategies. It is implementing the following two schools under its registration which are as below:

- 1) Devendra Nath Singh High School, Choreya. This school has total 700 children in different classes.
- 2) Ram Nath Nayak High School Akhtan, Burmu, Ranchi. This school has total 300 children in different classes.

These schools are affiliated by Jharkhand Academic Council with the initiative to mainstream poor, vulnerable, drop out children via formal schools and help these children achieve their goal.



WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

A. Sakhi

The project aims to enhance the capacity of women and identified support groups on advocacy and lobbying to address violence against women and facilitating political participation of women at all levels of governance. Violence against women needs to be seen as an issue that is based on the existing power relations, interpretation of masculinity and patriarchy that govern relationship between man and women.



Activities:

- A media capacity enhancement training on reporting of women's equal rights and VAW was organized by BKS in April, 2019. Objective of the training was to enhance the capacity of journalists to report on Violence against women.
- The 1st Quarterly meeting was held during May 2019 and the 2nd in August 2019. The purpose of the quarterly meeting was to assess the work done under the project by the project staffs and to plan for the next quarter. On the topics of Equal rights of women and Government Social security schemes training was provided to the participants.
- Training of advocacy team members on Advocacy actions held on 7th June 2019. The meeting of newly formed advocacy team was held in which following are the action plan made by the advocacy team as part of preparing a road map to move forward on the issues of VAW.
- 2 days training program was held for Advocates, Members of District Legal Authority (DALSA) and Sakhi didi's on equal rights for women and govt. social security schemes. The training was held on 15th-16th June 2019 at Swabhiman Kendra.
- Regional Advocacy Forum meeting was held on 20th August 2019 at Ranchi. The major highlights of the meetings conducted for discussing action plan prepared by the forum, the creation of voluntary contribution schemes on VAW, strengthening the role of media in accountability on VAW, collaboration with parliamentarians on policy and budget support for VAW, capacity building of CSOs to develop and implement locally relevant advocacy strategies on VAW, monitoring the implementation of work-plan commitments of CSOs,

- lobbying for increased sinancial support and improved political engagement of women
- On 20th September 2019, Sakhi Saheli Sammelan was organised at Swavalamban Kendra, Bijupara. The women said that in upcoming election the importance will be given to those who will work on the security of Women and girls. They will make sure that the other women of their surroundings vote to the person who promises to work on the issues of women and children. They were pretty much aware of the fact that the importance should be given to those who are likely to work for their security.
- Samudayak Champion (13th to 15th September 2019) -Through this program, the aim was to prepare women as community champions in each village so that the government-run schemes can be better implemented at the grassroots level. For this purpose, 95 women and adolescent girls of various villages of Chanho and Mandar block were trained by the various block level officials in the welfare schemes run by the government.
- On 2nd October 2019, Mahtama Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary birth anniversary was celebrated and 'Swachta hi Sewa' was organised at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara. To make a successful a plastic free society Bharat Abhiyan under which rally was organized.
- A stall was put up in the Mudama Mela on 14th and 15th October 2019 by BKS in which women protection and child rights were the main focused issue. Phamplets, posters, books and wall hangings on women rights, protection and empowerment were put up in the stall. Public awareness materials were displayed in the stall in the historic two-day Mudama Mela.
- On 5th November '19 November '19 a camp on Foster Care was organised by BKS in support of NCPCR. In this camp a total number of children who participated were 22 women and



youths were 50.

- Bharat Ki Beti Bharat Kilaxmi program was held at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara on 12th November 2019- Inauguration of computer centre and beautician training centre was done by Smt Karanpreet Kaur, Guest of Honour. She was quite pleased with the work going on there and expected more for the next time. Plantation of an Amla tree was done by our Chief Guest.
- In the month of the December 2019 a programme layout meeting was held with the partners and Sakhi didi's. Around 50 Sakhi didi (rural women and adolescents) and women/youth club members from various blocks of Ranchi district Chanhoh, Burmu, Kuru and the project staffs assembled together to acquire training on various issues related to women violence.
- An awareness program on 5th Assembly election through the SWEEP program was held on 5th December 2019 at Kishori Niketan, Bijupara. A rally was organized for motivating the voters in which the students of Saraswati Sishu Vidya Mandir, +2 School, and Awaam Sona Tana Bhagat School and BKS staffs participated..
- On 19th February 2020 a program was organized with the participation of Sakhi and Saheli of 8 villages in which they were told about Swavalamban Connect Kendra and SRC toll free no. i.e. 18003457055.
- On 12th March 2020 in Sukurhutu village a meeting of Sakhi and Saheli was organized to make them aware of the Swavalamban Kendra at Burmu and New Year calendar of BKS was also distributed among them.
- 25th March 2020 a meeting was organized at Barhe between the members of Sakhi and Saheli group members participate in this meeting, the discussion was made on celebration of upcoming Women's Day



LIVELIHOOD /SKILL TRAINING & PLACEMENT

A. Swavalamban

Swavalamban is a project of Bal Kalyan Sangh (BKS) supported by The Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands which provides free of cost skill development training program to the women and girls of Jharkhand in the age group of 18-35. The present scenario of the Jharkhand shows that most of the young girls of the interior areas are trafficked or falsely lured and taken to the metropolitan cities in search of work. The economically backward families who cannot afford the living cost of their



children send their children to work in the other states to earn some money and support their family but most of the time fake placement agencies sell these children specially girls to the hotels, brothels, Massage parlour etc., The project gives a opportunity to the girls who want to earn and improve their livelihood. The project is mainly focused on the girls who are survivors of trafficking or any abuse; vulnerable girls or women who migrate from Jharkhand; women and girls of tribal families with no source of regular income; the tribal youths who are in search of livelihood; the girls lured into extremism etc. The age limit for enrolling into the training programme is 18 years to 35 years with the minimum qualification needed is matric pass with reading and writing in hindi.

Goal: Strengthen the capacity of unemployed women, survivors or victim of trafficking or abuse and vulnerable poor girls in Jharkhand to improve their livelihoods and live with dignity and self respect.

Status: Around 160 girls have been imparted with the training of Housekeeping and Security guards.

Activities:

- Hamara Bachpan Hamara Adhikar programme held on 15th June, 2019 at JRU, Namkum, Ranchi, 80 girls who had received training of Security Guards and House Keeping from Swabhiman Kendra, BKS and have been rescued from different vulnerable fronts were rewarded with certificates by the chief guest Shri Priyank Kanoongo. In the program main focus was given on child laborers who all are working in our Jharkhand. Everyone took oath to remove child labor.
- Bharat Ki Beti Bharat Ki Lakshmi program was held at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara on 12th November 2019- Inauguration of computer centre and beautician training centre was done by Smt. Karanpreet Kaur, Guest of Honour. She was quite pleased with the work going on there and expected more for the next time. Plantation of an Amla tree was done by our Chief Guest.
- Oath Taking Ceremony - Certificate cum Oath taking ceremony of the 1st batch trainees of Security Guards conducted by Bal Kalyan Singh on 11th March 2019 at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara; 2nd batch trainees of security guards and Housekeeping were awarded on 15th June, 2019 at Jharkhand Rai University Campus Namkum, Ranchi and 3rd batch trainees were awarded certificates on 12th November 2019 at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara
- 15th February 2020 - the Swavalamban Kendra, Burmu was inaugurated by the President of NCPCR, the trainees were told that they need to be self-reliant; this training will help them to stay away from the issues such as soft trafficking and migration.



B Swavalamban Connect Kendra (SCK)

BKS is implementing a Swavalamban Connect Kendra (SCK) in the district of Ranchi under Mission Swavalamban in partnership with LetsEndorse Development Private Limited (LetsEndorse) with Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI).

To empower at least 300 aspirants. To build the necessary awareness and encouragement towards self-employment and enterprise creation among the masses (through gatherings, nukkad natak, in-person sessions, etc.), call-back the prospects assigned through the MIS portal and gather relevant information from the same to complete the aspirant's profile, understand and guide the aspirant through the necessary skill and entrepreneurship development programs supported by the Government, make attempts to help them refine their enterprise plans and keep track of how well the enterprise is performing over a period through regular check-ins.

In addition to spreading awareness and motivating the community to start the enterprises, to conduct adequate due-diligence of the aspirants to the extent possible. Emphasis would be laid on identifying potential business aspirants, nurturing and guiding them, strengthening their business plans, linking them to relevant skill-building/entrepreneurship training and bridging the capital gap as well as hand-holding them for a period of one year post enterprise setup, to ensure that their enterprises succeed.

In this FY we have reached around 40 aspirants via the SCK. Around 500 women and children reached & aware about the SCK.



ADVOCACY, TRAINING, WORKSHOPS & EVENTS

- 19th February 2020 - one day group orientation was given to the Sakhi and Saheli members about Swavalamban Connect Kendra (SCK) and the toll free no. attached to it at Kishori Niketan, Bijupara.

I. Training Programme of Sakhi Didis on the topics of Equal rights of women and Government Social security schemes at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara on 15th and 16th April 2019 - A Two day training programme was organized by BKS on the topics of Equal rights of women and Government Social security schemes. The training was held on 15- 16th April 2019 at Swabhiman Kendra, Bijupara. In the training the resource persons gave training on the mansion issues to the Sakhi didi, so that they can spread awareness in their communities and villages.

ii. One day National Consultation on Drugs and Substance use among Children and Adolescents organized by National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) AT New Delhi on 11th October 2019.

iii. A meeting was organized on 16th October 2019 by Jharkhand Swaishik Manch wherein various NGOs took part in which it was decided that Gram Sandesh Yatra will take place on 19th and 20th October 2019 in various districts of Jharkhand.

- xiii.** Bihar Voluntary Health Association (BVHA) meeting on 29th January 2020 – BVHA, which is a secular & voluntary association of charitable hospital, health centres in Patna, Bihar whose goal is to have a healthy community through community health action, by promoting social justice in the provision & distribution of health care.
