Develop a trusted bridge between dreams and aspirations of individual who cares nation and its realization.

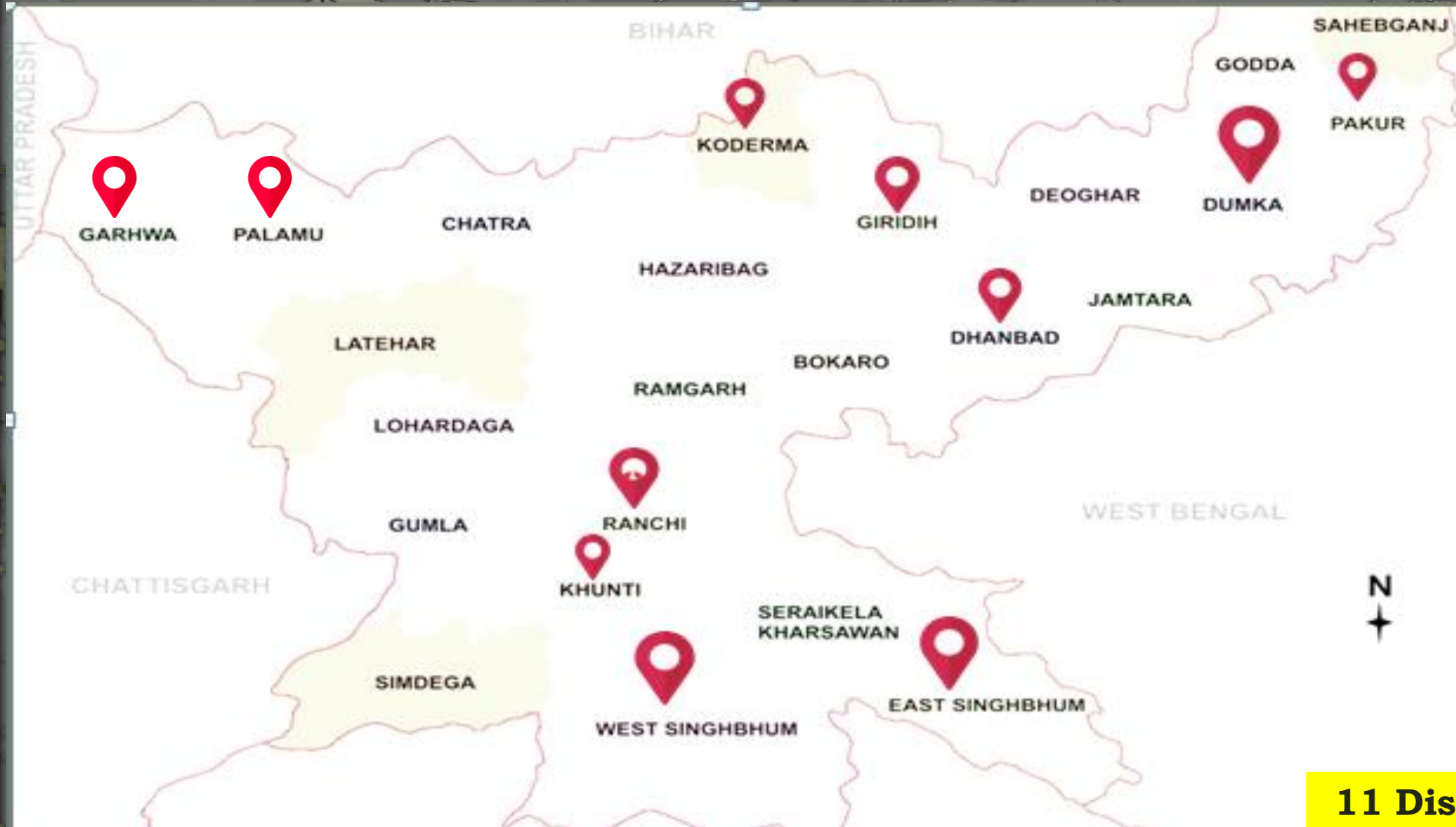

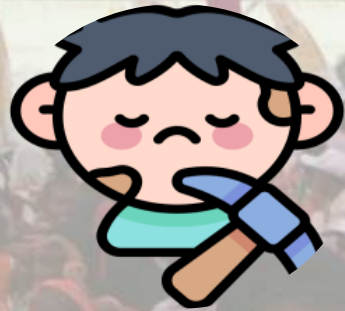

EMPOWERING GIRL CHILD

BKS empowering underprivileged children, especially girls, through education. The organization believes that education is the key to empower children and create a better future for them.

Sensitization, Workshops and Campaigns motivated young campaigns to voice for their own rights

Bridge courses for the school dropouts children through community learning centres in the rural areas of Jharkhand

The community learning centres can also serve as an alternative to schools, which may be far away or inaccessible for these children. By providing education in their communities, these children can learn without having to travel long distances

BKS runs various programs and initiatives that aim to provide education to children who are unable to attend school due to poverty, social inequality or discrimination. These programs include providing scholarships, mentoring, and tutoring to help children excel academically and develop essential life skills.

BKS also works to create awareness among parents, teachers, and the community about the importance of education for children, especially girls. MAKING A LASTING IMPACT



SWAVALAMBAN (An Initiative to combat human trafficking)



Causes of trafficking

Poverty: Poverty is one of the major causes of trafficking of tribal minors in Jharkhand. Many families are unable to provide for their children, and they see trafficking as a way to earn money.

Lack of education: Many tribal minors in Jharkhand are not educated, which makes them vulnerable to trafficking. Without education, they are unable to recognize the dangers of trafficking and are easily lured by traffickers.

Gender discrimination: There is discrimination against girls in many tribal communities in Jharkhand. Girls are often seen as a burden on the family and are married off at a young age. This makes them vulnerable to trafficking.

Lack of awareness: There is a lack of awareness about the dangers of trafficking among tribal communities in Jharkhand. Parents are often unaware of the risks and allow their children to migrate to cities with promises of employment.

Preventive measures –

Joint initiatives between governments and private sector companies to provide employment opportunities for vulnerable populations at risk of being trafficked

BKS is the Jharkhand state Secretariat of Action Against Trafficking & Sexual Exploitation of Children, India (A South Asian network of NGO's to combat Human Trafficking)



Girls survivors of trafficking were trained as housekeeping professionals placed in a renowned institutions.

Swavalamban is an initiative to provide skill development training and livelihood opportunities to the survivors of trafficking. The aim of Swavalamban is to empower these survivors by enabling them to acquire appropriate skills and knowledge that can help them earn a livelihood and become self-sufficient.

The organization also creates awareness on the impact of trafficking on individuals and families, and works with the government and police to ensure effective implementation of anti-trafficking laws. Through its efforts, BKS has prevented countless cases of trafficking and brought justice to many victims.

BKS working to combat child trafficking and exploitation in India. The organisation provides shelter, education, counseling, and vocational training to these vulnerable children, many of whom come from poor and marginalized communities. Through its efforts, BKS Foundation aims to empower these children and prevent them from falling prey to traffickers and abusers. By building community support BKS developed community-wide initiatives to support survivors of human trafficking, such as creating networks of safe housing, organizing job training programs, and providing access to counseling services.

509 children in the span of two years were rescued from New Delhi and rehabilitated in their respective hometowns with the support of relevant stakeholders

SAMVARDHAN – II

(Mapping of vulnerable children and Families to Child Trafficking during COVID-19 Times and Identification of Hotspot Areas in East Singhbhum of Jharkhand)



“Together we can and Together we will.”

The project’s main objective was to highlight and explore vulnerabilities that leave children at risk of being trafficked; associated vulnerabilities that increase the risk of trafficking and exploitation of children during transit and to identify vulnerable parents eligible for government social Security scheme.

BKS in collaboration with district administration of East Singhbhum and NCPCR conducted vulnerable mapping in the district where it was found that 7026 children are at risk and vulnerable to different forms of exploitation.

This study is also considered unique as BKS is involving the grassroot level system of the Government i.e. the VCPC, AWW, School Teachers and PRI’s to collect the primary data from the field.

A state level dissemination workshop was organized with the district administration, state and child protection stakeholders as part of sharing the feedback and recommendations received in the study so as to advocate with Government and share the data and report with the Government to support the children and families by linking the listed children and their families with the Government Social Security Schemes of Jharkhand.

From the administrative point of view this district has been divided into two Sub-Division Dhalbhum and Ghatshila. The district consists of eleven blocks namely Golmuri-cum Jugsalai(Jamshedpur), Potka, Patamda and Boram in Dhalbhum Sub-Division and Ghatshila, Musabani, Dumaria, Baharagora, Dhalbhumgarh, Chakulia and Gurabandha in Ghatshila Sub-Division. There are 231 Panchayat and about 1810 revenue villages out of which 1669 Revenue Villages are inhabited and rest 141 Revenue villages are uninhabited. The Head Quarter of this district is Jamshedpur.

प्रदेश में मानव तस्करी की शिकार 90% बच्चियां आदिवासी



एक्सप्रेस

आशीष तिववा

झारखंड में मानव तस्करी का शिकार होने वाली बच्चियों में 90 फीसदी आदिवासी हैं। वहीं दस फीसदी दलित समुदाय से हैं। झारखंड से मानव तस्करी (ह्यूमन ट्रैफिकिंग) को लेकर यह जानकारी डॉ. रामदयाल मुंडा जनजातीय कल्याण शोध संस्थान (टीआरआई) द्वारा कराए गए शोध में मिली है। टीआरआई के लिए यह शोध मानव तस्करी पर काम करने वाली संस्था भारतीय किसान संघ (अब बाल कल्याण संघ) ने किया है। टीआरआई की ओर से जारी रिपोर्ट के अनुसार झारखंड से ज्यादातर बच्चियों को दिल्ली, हरियाणा व

पंजाब पहुंचाया जाता है। इसके अलावा इन्हें बंगाल, ओडिशा, बिहार और असम भी भेजा जाता है। हरियाणा और पंजाब जैसे राज्य में ये जबर्न शादी के लिए बेची जाती हैं जबकि अन्य राज्यों में इनकी ट्रैफिकिंग घरेलू काम के लिए होती। इन राज्यों में इन्हें प्लेसमेंट एजेंसियों के माध्यम से खरीदा-बेचा जाता है। यूपी में कालीन उद्योग के लिए झारखंड के बच्चों की काफी तस्करी हुई है। रिपोर्ट के अनुसार मानव तस्करी की शिकार इन बच्चियों में 30 फीसदी हाई स्कूल तक पढ़ी होती हैं जबकि 30 फीसदी मीडिल और 14 फीसदी प्राइमरी पास। 26 फीसदी अशिक्षित हैं। इसी तरह उत्तर प्रदेश के कालीन उद्योग में पलामू-गढ़वा जिले के 11 हजार बाल मजदूर कार्यरत हैं।

रिपोर्ट के अनुसार नक्सली संकट और खनन क्षेत्रों में विस्थापन मानव तस्करी की बड़ी वजह रही। खुटी में ऐसे कई मामले सामने आए जिसमें नक्सलियों से तंग महिलाएं मानव तस्करों के चंगुल में फंस गईं। घनबाद में कोयला उठाने का काम बिहार व यूपी के लोगों को मिल रहा है। इसके कारण स्थानीय महिलाएं रोजगार से वंचित हो रही हैं। रिपोर्ट के अनुसार अवैध कोयला कारोबारी स्थानीय महिलाओं को वेश्यावृत्ति में धकेलते हैं। इससे बचने के लिए वे खुद को मानव तस्करों के हवाले कर देती हैं। यह अध्ययन 2018-2019 सत्र के लिए कराया गया था। इसे बीकेएस के सचिव संजय मिश्रा के मार्गदर्शन में किया गया इसमें बाल कल्याण समिति आदि के आंकड़ों का भी अध्ययन किया गया है।

26 minor girls brought back to state 1 yr after their rescue

The Girls Were Languishing In New Delhi's Rescue Centres

Ranchi: Twenty-six minor girls, who were rescued from traffickers in different parts of Delhi and surrounding areas through the state's Integrated Rehabilitation and Resource Centre (IRRC), arrived at the railway station here on Friday.

The girls were languishing in different rescue centres of the national capital for over a year as their return was delayed because of the Covid-19 pandemic and the non-completion of required processes, including getting permission from the local child welfare committee and the police besides address verification.

Among the rescued girls, eight each are from Gumla and Sahibganj districts and five from West Singhbhum district. The others belong to Bo-

karo Dhanbad and Simdega districts. Among them is a girl who is only eight years old.

One of the rescued girls is a 17-year-old from Godda district. She lost her father at the age of seven. After studying till Class VII, the girl wanted to support her mother who worked as a labourer. She eventually came in contact with an agent. Ajmat Ansari, who started physically exploit-

ing her in name of providing her job in cities.

Ajmat brought the girl to Delhi and sold her at Shakarpur. After a tip-off, the IRRC rescued the girl along with another from a brothel in Sukur Vihar. Two traffickers were also arrested in the operation.

After arrival at the railway station, one of the girls said, "My employers put a burden

on me with lots of work. He scolded and beat me when I was unable to fulfil all his orders."

The children were now handed over to the district child protection officers (DCPO) concerned at the railway station.

Sanjay Mishra, secretary of Bal Kalyan Sangh, which runs the IRRC said, "The DCPO has to rehabilitate the children in their respective districts. The children and their parents would be linked to different social welfare schemes of the state government. The state resource centre will take regular feedback about the condition of the children."

He added after the girls turned 18, they would be trained in various vocational courses, like security guards, so that they can readily find jobs to be in the mainstream.

Research Study On HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN JHARKHAND

"A Research Study on Human Trafficking in Jharkhand" so that all the stakeholders can work together to combat the issue of trafficking in Jharkhand & make people aware of effective prevention in the future. The study is initiated by the Bal Kalyan Sangh (BKS), Ranchi. BKS conducted a meeting with the Experts and Consultants to prepare the study design, methodology and to enable the selection of districts. The selection of districts has been done on the basis of incidences of trafficking, migration and also keeping in view the geographical coverage from all regions of the state.

Background: Grievance Redress Mechanism is part and parcel of the machinery of any administration. No administration can claim to be accountable, responsive and user-friendly unless it has established an efficient and effective grievance redress mechanism. In fact, the grievance redress mechanism of an organization is the gauge to measure its efficiency and effectiveness as it provides important feedback on the working of the administration. This is more so for any rights based services, schemes and entitlements meant for children. It is believed that a well-defined institutional mechanism for grievance redress involves a system of registering, investigating and responding within a well-appointed time frame. This will have to be done along with the implementation agency, which is charged with the actual redress of the grievance by ensuring that the rights provided under the Act is ensured.

NCPCR under Section 31 of the RTE Act, 2009 has been mandated to examine and review the provisions, rights and entitlements provided under the Act and recommend measures for its effective implementation; to inquire into complaints relating to violation of child's right to free and compulsory education and to take necessary steps as provided under Section 15 of CPCR Act, 2005. BKS under the guidance of Commission has taken up this study involving 10 states in all regions of the country including north, south, east, west, central and north-east region.

Balkunj is a Child Care Institution of BKS situated at West Singhbhum (Chaibasa) particularly for boys in the age group of 6 to 18 years which got started in the month of September 2016. The children who went missing or are footpath beggars, wanderers, child rescued from any sort of child labor, children whose parents are no more and doesn't have a place to stay are provided the facility of shelter, food, counseling, care, daily needs, education and different types of training on life skill and increasing motivation. From the year 2021-2022, there are 82 children residing in the home and in coordination with CWC and district administration restoration of the children are being done.

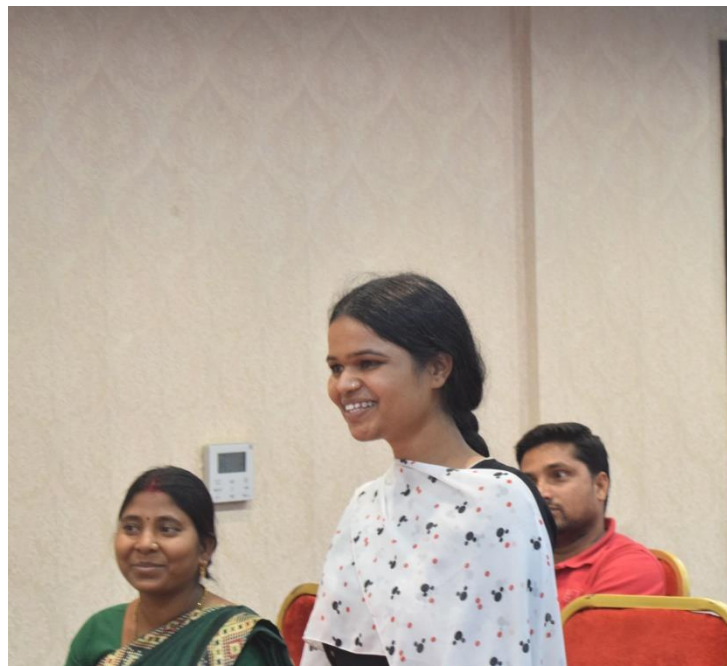

BKS working as a nodal organization for Childline services in Pakur district of Jharkhand, India. The following activities have been taken as a Nodal organisation.

Helpline service: We operate a 24/7 helpline service that offers support and advice to children and young people in need. The helpline can be accessed by phone, email, or online chat.

Online safety service: The online safety advice and support for children and young people who may be at risk of online bullying, grooming, or exploitation. Childline team also provides resources and guidance for parents and caregivers on how to keep their children safe online.

Outreach and awareness-raising: We conduct community outreach programs to raise awareness about child protection issues and to promote the rights of children. They also organize events and campaigns to promote child safety and wellbeing.

Counseling and therapy: We provide counseling and therapy services to children and young people who have experienced abuse, neglect, or other forms of trauma. They operate child-friendly counseling centers across India where children can receive confidential support and care.

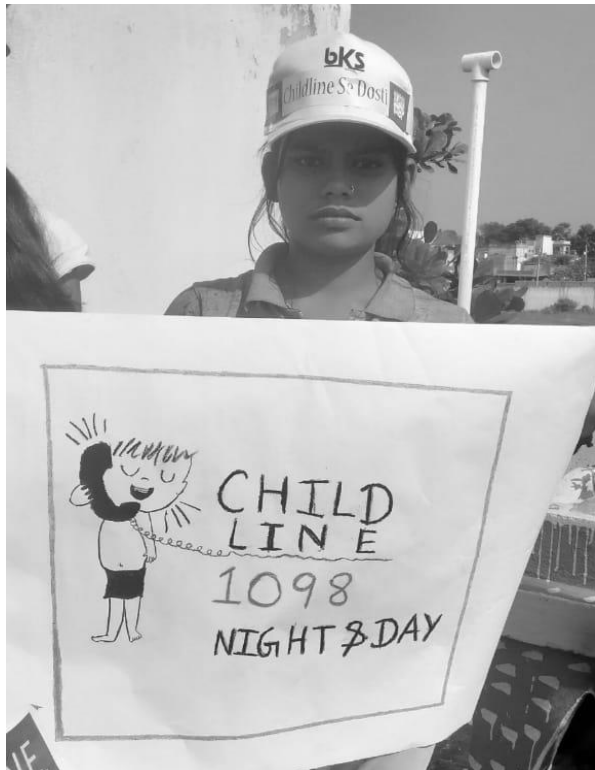

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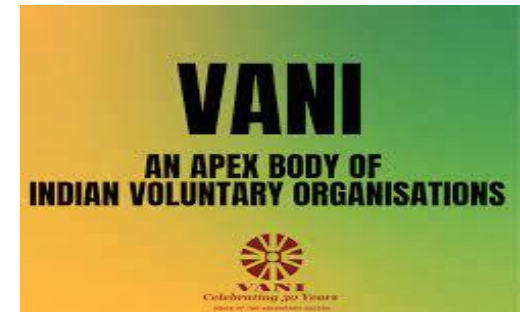


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
