



CASE STORY



"Collaborative Efforts Secure Education for Siblings in Rural Jharkhand"

Mannu (Name Changed), an 11-year-old girl, and Sangita (Name Changed), a 9-year-old girl, faced immense hardship after losing their parents at a tender age in Dighi Village, located in the Patamda block of East Singhbhum district, Jharkhand. As orphans, they struggled to access their fundamental right to education and secure a formal schooling opportunity. Their plight came to light during a vulnerable mapping exercise conducted by Bal Kalyan Sangh, with the support of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), the East Singhbhum district administration, and The Asia Foundation, the exercise aimed to

identify and assist children in vulnerable situations.

Upon discovering Mannu and Sangita's circumstances, the collaborative effort swiftly intervened, linking the orphaned sisters to sponsorship schemes. These schemes provide financial assistance and facilitate their enrollment in formal schools, ensuring they can continue their education without further disruption.

Thanks to the concerted efforts of the various stakeholders, Mannu and Sangita now have the opportunity to attend school regularly, receive quality education, and pave the way for a brighter future. This case highlights the importance of collaborative efforts between government agencies, non-profit organizations, and international development partners in addressing the challenges faced by vulnerable children, particularly in remote and underprivileged areas. By securing access to education for Mannu and Sangita, this initiative not only upholds their fundamental rights but also empowers them to break the cycle of poverty and build a better life for themselves. It serves as a testament to the transformative power of education and the collective responsibility of society to protect and nurture its most vulnerable members.

Prevention of Cross-Border Trafficking in Bihar and Jharkhand



The issue of human trafficking and sexual exploitation has a deep-rooted history, reaching a global scale with profound consequences. This problem transcends specific countries or regions; instead, it has become a pressing concern worldwide. Recent research reveals a disturbing reality: over a million children are trafficked annually for the sex trade, and in Asia alone, more than a million women and girls are victims of the sex industry. Beyond its immediate impact, this issue is intricately linked to fatal health problems such as HIV/AIDS, now a global pandemic. While the scale of the problem is indeed alarming, it is equally disheartening to witness the growth of human trafficking and the sex trade into lucrative global industries. These industries exploit vulnerable individuals, perpetuating immense human suffering. Shockingly, estimates suggest that between 12,000 to 15,000 girls aged 6 to 16 are trafficked annually from India to Nepal. The current situation is particularly dire concerning human trafficking along the Indo-Nepal border, especially in the border areas of Bihar. The Cross-Border Trafficking Workshop was a comprehensive event designed to address the multifaceted issue of human trafficking across the Indo-Nepal border

ARARIA, BIHAR

District level Consultation Workshop on "Cross Border Trafficking Prevention" in Bihar - Supported by The Asia Foundation

In a significant step towards addressing the critical issue of cross-border trafficking, a District Level Workshop on Cross-Border Trafficking was organized in Araria, Bihar. This initiative was undertaken by ATSEC (Action against Trafficking and Sexual Exploitation of Children), the Bihar and Jharkhand chapter dedicated to combating child trafficking and exploitation.

The primary objective of the consultation was twofold: to identify the root causes of cross-border trafficking in the region and to develop effective prevention mechanisms tailored to the local context. By bringing together stakeholders from various sectors, the workshop aimed to foster a collaborative approach in tackling this complex challenge.

Participants in the workshop included representatives from law enforcement agencies, local government officials, civil society organizations, and community leaders. The discussions focused on understanding the



underlying factors that contribute to cross-border trafficking, such as poverty, lack of economic opportunities, and societal norms that perpetuate vulnerability.

Through comprehensive deliberations, the workshop sought to devise strategies to address these root causes, emphasizing the need for a multi-pronged approach encompassing awareness campaigns, community engagement, and economic empowerment initiatives. Additionally, the importance of strengthening cross-border cooperation and intelligence sharing among law enforcement agencies was underscored.

SUPAUL, BIHAR

District level Consultation Workshop on "Cross Border Trafficking Prevention" in Bihar - Supported by The Asia Foundation

The Cross-Border Trafficking Workshop addressed the critical issue of human trafficking and sexual exploitation,

acknowledging its global impact and profound consequences. The workshop, focusing on the Indo-Nepal border, brought together a diverse group of stakeholders to create a coordinated front against cross-border trafficking.

The primary objective was to establish a resilient and coordinated approach to eradicate cross-border trafficking in the Indo-Bihar Nepal Borders region. The workshop aimed to formulate actionable strategies tailored to the geographical context through active participant involvement.

Several critical discussion points emerged, including the vital role of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), the increasing use of cybercrime in trafficking, the importance of public awareness and online platforms, comprehensive victim protection and support, the need for preventive measures, and anticipation of



future trends and challenges. The workshop generated key recommendations, emphasizing intensive efforts at the local level, targeted advocacy with government stakeholders, enhanced collaboration among cross-border entities, victim-centric approaches, community engagement programs, and the establishment of a robust monitoring and evaluation system. In conclusion, the workshop not only illuminated the challenges but paved the way for actionable strategies and collaborations.

PATNA, BIHAR

State level Consultation Workshop on "Cross Border Trafficking Prevention" in Bihar - Supported by The Asia Foundation

A workshop was organized to bring together various stakeholders and experts to address the pressing issues of human trafficking and cyber crime in Patna, Bihar. The event served as a platform for in-depth discussions, sharing alarming statistics, and gaining diverse perspectives on these challenges. The overarching goal was to develop a comprehensive action plan to tackle these crimes effectively, with a particular emphasis on protecting women and children, who are often the most vulnerable populations. Recognizing the need for coordinated efforts, recommendations were made to strengthen Anti-Trafficking Clubs by increasing membership, providing regular training, and allocating resources to empower members to identify, prevent, and assist in rescue operations related to trafficking. Additionally, participants advocated for the establishment of a dedicated Child Commission in Bihar to address the



unique needs and challenges faced by children affected by trafficking, ensuring their rights and welfare are protected. To ensure a comprehensive approach, fostering partnerships and collaborations between the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and other stakeholders was deemed crucial. Prioritizing the development and improvement of rehabilitation and support services for survivors of trafficking was also highlighted, with a focus on long-term reintegration into society through skills training and psychosocial support.

Furthermore, implementing awareness campaigns and educational initiatives targeting schools, colleges, and communities was recommended to raise awareness about the realities of human trafficking and cyber crime, with a particular emphasis on vulnerable populations such as women and children. Specific action points included developing comprehensive training programs for Anti-Trafficking club members, organizing awareness campaigns, advocating for resource allocation towards rehabilitation programs, lobbying for the establishment of a Child Commission in Bihar, strengthening collaboration between law enforcement agencies, NGOs, and stakeholders, conducting research and analysis on emerging cyber crime trends, advocating for the implementation and enforcement of Acts such as the Juvenile Justice (JJ) Act, and establishing a dedicated helpline or hotline for reporting suspected trafficking cases and cyber crime incidents.

Through this collaborative effort, involving various stakeholders and implementing targeted recommendations and action points, the workshop aimed to combat human trafficking and cyber crime effectively, ensuring the safety and well-being of vulnerable populations, particularly women and children.

State Level Consultation on Gender Equality and Disability was organised under C20 G20 India Programme on Gender & Disability at, Patna Bihar by Bal Kalyan Sangh (BKS), Ranchi, in collaboration with Jan Jagran Sansthan Bihar. CSOs, community media, and governments play crucial roles in promoting the inclusion, rights, and empowerment of vulnerable and marginalized groups like women, disabled persons, and the transgender community. Capacity building initiatives by CSOs are vital for developing decision-making skills in these groups, while governments must ensure basic necessities are provided equitably and justly, along with strengthening safety mechanisms for vulnerable families. Collaborative efforts between CSOs and governments should strategize for overall development. Despite rescue efforts, child rights violations like child labor persist in Bihar, necessitating skill development for rescued children to prevent revictimization. Education is key, requiring addressing systemic gaps, promoting girls' education, and providing quality, accessible education for disabled children. Equal participation of women at the community level and proper implementation of women empowerment programs should be ensured, prioritizing skill development under the "One Nation, One Family, One Future" theme. Gender-centric programs with separate budgets for gender equality and SMART monitoring are needed. For the upliftment of disabled persons, disability centers, shelters, infrastructure accessibility, increased employment reservations, revised disability pensions, and RTE provisions should be implemented. Strong women's safety measures are crucial in Bihar.



Taking it forward using the Thrive Scale Methodology of Miracle Foundation India to identify these vulnerable families and children. The program aims to provide support to 1,000 such families across three selected blocks in the district, where children face the risk of separation from their families. Additionally, the program will facilitate the transition of children from all Child Care Institutions (CCIs) in the Kolhan region, which includes East Singhbhum, West Singhbhum, and Saraikela Kharsawan districts, back to their families. The program is focused on strengthening family support systems and preventing family separation, ultimately aiming to improve the well-being and stability of children in the region. Through this collaborative effort involving various stakeholders, the program seeks to address the issue of children at risk of being separated from their families by providing support to vulnerable families and facilitating the reintegration of children from CCIs into their families, thereby promoting child welfare and family preservation in the targeted areas.

Balkunj - Child Care Institution

Balkunj is a Child Care Institution run by BKS in West Singhbhum (Chaibasa) for boys aged 6 to 18 years. Established in September 2016, it caters to children who are missing, homeless, or rescued. The institution provides shelter, food, counseling, education, and life skills training to 41 children. With the support of the district administration, efforts are being made to reintegrate the children with their families.

Balkunj also focuses on the overall development of the children by organizing various recreational and educational activities such as sports tournaments, cultural events, and workshops. The institution aims to create a safe and nurturing environment for the children, where they can heal from their past experiences and build a brighter future for themselves. In addition to providing basic necessities and education, Balkunj also offers vocational training programs to equip the children with essential skills that will help them become self-reliant in the future. The staffs at Balkunj are dedicated to providing love, care, and support to the children, helping them overcome their past experiences and develop into confident and capable individuals.



Childline

From April 2024 to August 31, 2024

Bal Kalyan Sangh (BKS), runs

Childline 1098 in Dhanbad, received a total of 164 calls, addressing a variety of child protection issues, including child labor, trafficking, and abuse. During this period, BKS actively engaged in several initiatives aimed at safeguarding children's rights and well-being. This included collaborative meetings with Anganwadi workers to reinforce grassroots child protection mechanisms, discussing early childhood care, child nutrition, and the role of these workers in reporting cases to Childline. The organization also hosted open house programs, providing a platform for children and community members to express their

concerns and participate in dialogues surrounding child protection and safety. In addition to these engagements, BKS carried out extensive awareness campaigns focused on educating communities about child rights, child marriage, child labor, and trafficking. Utilising posters, pamphlets, and other IEC materials, the campaigns ensured effective outreach to marginalised groups. BKS also conducted regular Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) meetings to inform and train local leaders about their crucial roles in child protection, fostering the formation of village-level child protection committees. Rescue and rehabilitation efforts remained a cornerstone of BKS's work, with numerous children being successfully rescued from harmful situations and

provided with psychosocial support, counseling, and access to government welfare schemes. The organization further enhanced awareness through cultural and interactive programs like street plays (nukkad natak), performed in local markets, villages, and urban slums.

From Shadows to Security: Mansi's Journey for Respect and Self-Reliance.

Mansi's (name changed) story unfolds as a testament to resilience and the transformative power of opportunity. A vibrant student of class 12th, Mansi once filled her days with the excitement of football and the fascination of geography, Hindi, and history. Her cheerful spirit seemed unbreakable, until poverty opened the door to exploitation. Mansi's family struggled at the lower rungs of society. Her father, a farmer, and her mother, a laborer, toiled to support their children. With two elder brothers without income and a younger sibling to care for, the weight of financial burden hung

heavy over their household. It was in this vulnerable state that an agent approached Mansi with a glimmer of hope - a job opportunity in Ranchi. The promise of financial support for her parents and younger brother was too enticing to ignore. Little did she know, this decision would lead her through what she later described as "the doors of hell." The job in Ranchi revealed itself to be a trap. As a house help, Mansi found herself working 12-14 hour days for meager, if any, pay. Beyond the exhausting work, she endured ill-treatment and abuse from her employers, stripping away her dignity and spirit. Despite the hardships, Mansi's inner strength prevailed. She made the courageous decision to return home. This wasn't a retreat, but a resolve to find a path that would provide both financial stability and restore her sense of self-worth. Through awareness she got introduced herself to the security guard training program, opening a new chapter in her life. "It is a great place to be. The environment and the people make you feel safe. The training has changed my life, and now I can proudly say I can earn for my family with a job that has dignity and respect."For Mansi, the security guard training represents more than just a job opportunity. It's a chance to rewrite her story, to transform from a victim of circumstance to a strong, independent woman.

Research study on "Review Of Mechanism Developed In Status U/S 32 Of The RTE Act in 10 states of India under the guidance of NCPCR" (National Commission for the Protection of Child Rights)



Background: Section 32 of the Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009, outlines the grievance redressal mechanism for addressing violations of the rights provided under the Act. It allows any child or their parent or guardian to file a complaint if they believe a right has been violated. The first level of redressal is through the local authority, which is responsible for investigating and addressing the complaint. If the issue remains unresolved, the complainant can escalate the matter to the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (SCPCR) or the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR). Both the local authority and SCPCR/NCPCR are required to resolve complaints within a stipulated time frame. This system ensures that no child is denied their right to education due to systemic failures.

Bal Kalyan Sangh, under the guidance of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), conducted a study on grievance redressal mechanisms across 10 states, including Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Sikkim, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand. As part of this initiative, NCPCR organized a consultation meeting with relevant stakeholders on 5th August 2024 to discuss findings and address key issues related to the grievance redressal system.




